



March 1923: New school colors, as well as a new mascot, were chosen by the student body to celebrate the new Arlington High School building near the southeast corner of Cooper and Abram.



The Legend (or History) of LITTLE ARLIE

continuing to be known as the gold and black Yellowjackets, the students voted to become the Arlington Colts and to wear the Green and White. (As told

by the late Bill Bardin, Class of 1924.) **1950:** Mayor Tom Vandergriff, AHS '43, presented a white Shetland pony

to be the student body's mascot. Reba Davis Walker, '53, won the \$10 prize by submitting the name, *Little Arlie*. The first trainers were



Hugh Ross, '51, Bobby Burnett, '51 and Dave Hurn, '53. On the night of Arlie's debut, the trainers were unable to find a truck and trailer to trans-

port Arlie from the far east end of town to the stadium on the college campus. With Hugh's parents out of town, they decided to borrow the Ross' sedan. With Arlie in the back seat – head out the window, they drove down Abram with citizens clapping and cheering along the way. They managed to get Arlie to the field in time for his much anticipated debut and his first ever run d o w n the field as the A H S C olts

charged behind. (As told by the late Hugh Ross, who was eventually forgiven by his parents.) For 30 years, Arlie's pre-game run supercharged the Colt fans. Artificial turf ended his career but not our mascot. Little Arlie still rules at pep rallies and games beloved by all Colts.
