



#### Arlington High Fun Facts

- Arlington High School, corner of Cooper and Abram, opened 1923 separating from South Side
- Former colors: black/gold
- Former mascot: Yellowjackets
- March 23, 1923, student body chose new colors: green/white
- New mascot: Colts
- History teacher Miss Cravens told her class to always remember the day these decisions were made because they were more important than the War of 1812.
