Listen to our newest officer—Vice-President of the Alumni Association—Alan Stiebing, '86, tell of his days at AHS: I played in the Colt Band under the direction of my favorite teacher Randy Garmon. In addition, I played in the jazz

band and played double bass in the orchestra. I have played trombone in the Alumni Band since the second year of its formation. Although I also enjoyed geometry (even handled the geometry leg on the math team), and graphic arts and computer programming, my music classes led to my music education major at Texas Wesleyan. 


