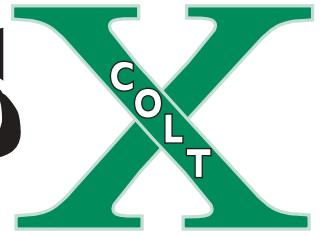

The More Things Change The More They Stay The Same.

That's a truth borne out when taking a close look at the demographics of Arlington High School. If you graduated before 1957, this campus wasn't your school. If you graduated before 1965, the Arlington ISD wasn't integrated. If you graduated before 1975, you left before the wave of Vietnamese refugees reached our city. You get the drift.

Students at the other high schools (all opened in 1970 or later) have been quoted as looking down on our AHS campus as old-fashioned, ugly, and poor. After all, its terrazo steps are worn down in the middle. Its campus is hemmed in and hodge-podge. Why, it even has some classrooms with windows—that open!! (See page 4. Those catty students might have a point.)

Truth be told, though, AHS has something else that differentiates it from the other schools. AHS has students who transfer to Arlington High from those newer, fancier schools. On May 23, 2011, AHS had an enrollment of 2,714 students, 700 of which were transfer students from the other high schools. That's 26% of the total enrollment of our school filled with Arlington teens who **WANT** to be **HERE** instead of enrolled in their home schools.

And just why is that? Listen to the comments of our **2011 Alumni Scholars** to answer that question.

"All my peers seemed to find their own 'safe place' in organizations where they made close friendships."

"I walk into the school and am instantly greeted with positive energy."

"I fell in love with AHS the moment I set foot on campus."

"I feel like I actually made a difference at Arlington High."

"AHS is beautiful. Sometimes we go through it too quickly because there's not enough time to enjoy the simplicity of it. But when you've been at the school from six in the morning to one in the morning, you really do see how amazingly beautiful your school is."

All alumni can be proud that Arlington High has stood the test of time and that its students today feel the same way we did about it all those years ago.
